Hi, and welcome to our third Apollomemories newsletter.


Over the Christmas period we emailed many of the acts that played at the Apollo and asked them to contribute their memories.

It's Good It's Greens


Here is an image of the Green's Playhouse from 1948.



The image shows the original facing (marquee) of the building, which was made of ornate bronze, opal glass and milk glass and finished off with hundreds of bulbs. The Scottish weather took its toll on the original marquee was removed and replaced by the more familiar and less grand vertical sign PLAYHOUSE during a renovation a few years later.

Many of you will know that in 1978 the then owners of the Apollo, Unicorn was about to relinquish their lease on the building and Mecca announced that they wished to turn the Apollo into a Bingo Hall.

This resulted in a massive outcry and it is estimated that 100,000 signatures were collected, which included such stars as Paul McCartney and Eric Clapton.



We would like to talk to Valerie Paul and Christine Oliver who helped save the Apollo from closure back in 1978 by running their own petition, which attracted 18,000 names.
